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The audience at the Haymarket Theatre in Basingstoke was treated to a rare evening of joyous theatre. For one night only, the Limington House School players performed a modern interpretation of Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream. The company, made up entirely of young people with multiple and complex learning disabilities, gave a stunning performance that delighted the audience and stood out among the three school productions.

The tale was re-imagined as a video game with three players controlling the characters in the play. The Haymarket stage cannot accommodate wheelchairs so the LHS wheelchair users became the game players and were projected onto video screens at the back of the stage. The narrator used an electronic communicator to set the scene and take the story forward. Music was used effectively to take the players from scene to scene. The finale featured all the players singing "You've Got A Friend In Me" bringing a lump to the throat!

All the traditional characters were there - a strong Oberon; a demure Titania with her fairies; an energetic Puck; Bottom and the Mechanicals plus dancing flowers and musicians. A new character was added - the Star. The student playing the Star deserves a special commendation for stepping in with 2 hours notice as the original Star was unable to perform.

The actors were discreetly and deftly supported by largely un-noticed staff and their director.

The audience reaction was enthusiastic and appreciative with prolonged applause. The smiles and happy faces of the players reflected in those who had watched this spectacular performance.

What will LHS Players do next? Whatever it is, it will be fantastic. Do not forget to look out for next years hot ticket - for one night only!
